The Master of Public Health (MPH) degree at the Harvard School of Public Health requires a prior professional degree at the doctoral or master's level. Please note: In addition to completing a degree, relevant experience is also an important factor in considering applicants for admission.

Combined and Joint Degrees

Students in medical school, osteopathy school, and dental school are eligible to apply for the MPH between their third and fourth year (or following their fourth year) of study.

Students at the Harvard Law School are eligible for the JD/MPH.

Applicants who hold a master's degree should also have at least three to five years of relevant health-related work experience following completion of their master's degree.
