

Principles and Practice of Public Health Writing

The goal of this new non-credit course is to provide authors with the tools and knowledge needed to produce writing that is clear, concise and well organized, by exploring the basic structures of written English to determine how and why some writing reads well while other writing does not. We will then focus on how to revise writing so that it flows coherently and its logic is transparent.

Each class will include discussion, writing exercises, peer review and feedback. As this is a non-credit course, much of our work will be done in the classroom, though participants are expected to come to each class fully prepared.

This course will meet in Fall 2 on Wednesdays, 5:30-7:20 pm, in Kresge 203, October 28–December 16. Class size is limited and instructor's permission is required to join.
