Eligibility

Candidates are typically pre and post-doctoral degree-holders (MD, DVM, PhD) who are accepted to the doctoral program in Epidemiology or Environmental Health at HSPH. Post-doctoral fellows with a prior doctoral degree in Epidemiology, Biology, Industrial Hygiene or Medicine are considered for training in Cancer or Molecular Epidemiology.
