

The Harvey V. Fineberg Fellowship in Cancer Prevention 2010-2011

The Harvard School of Public Health's Departments of Epidemiology; Society, Human Development and Health; Nutrition; and the Dana-Farber Center invite applications for the Harvey Fineberg Fellowship in Cancer Prevention (2010-2011).

The program's objective is to train researchers in the design and evaluation of cancer prevention and control. Applicants may work in any area related to cancer prevention. In addition to prevention policy, potential areas of research include health care providers, worksites, schools or youth, or under-served populations.

Levels of Training: Pre- and Post Doctoral

Length of Training: 1 academic year July 1, 2010-September 1, 2011

Application Deadline: February 15th, 2010
