## Post-Doctoral Fellow in Demographic Change and Economic Growth in the Program on the Global Demography of Aging

Qualified applicants are sought for a post-doctoral fellowship in demographic change and economic growth, sponsored by the Program on the Global Demography of Aging (PGDA). The successful post-doctoral fellow will continue his/her training through a one or two-year fellowship in the PGDA. The post-doctoral fellow will work directly with Professors David E. Bloom and David Canning on issues relating to the effect of demographic change (for example, fertility reduction and population aging) on economic growth. Fellows will also be expected to develop their own research in this area and to undertake a small amount of graduate level teaching.

### Eligibility:

Applicants should have a recent Ph.D. in economics, and have a strong background in macroeconomics, economic growth, and econometrics (for example, dynamic panel data models). Fellows will be selected on the basis of their academic achievement and promise, regardless of nationality. Qualified women and minority candidates are particularly encouraged to apply.

### Amount:

Minimum \$45,000. In addition to the annual salary, Fellows will have access to a full range of university resources including benefits.

### Applications:

Interested applicants should submit:

- a curriculum vita
- graduate and undergraduate transcripts
- a sample of published or unpublished work (journal length article)
- the names of three referees as well as their contact phone numbers and email addresses.
