*Dr. Tellier served as UNFPA Representative in China working on reproductive rights and quality of care until very recently. In 1979 she opened the UNFPA Office in China. Under her leadership UNFPA support helped lay the foundation for the first modern census, and also funded graduate training in the U.S. for some of China's leading demographers. She was the UNFPA Country director in Afghanistan in the late 1970s, supporting preparation for a census that was interrupted by the 1978 revolution. She also served as Director of the International Department of the Danish Red Cross.*
