

Canvas Guide | Student Account Settings

Canvas is the learning management system at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. It is where to access your daily coursework and assignments.







What should I do first in Canvas?

Login

O Login at <u>canvas.harvard.edu</u>. Need login help? Visit <u>key.harvard.edu</u>.

Account

- O **Settings. Verify your school email address**. (Click Account \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow look in top right for 'Ways to Contact).
- O **Settings. Optional Select your Personal Pronouns** (Click Account → Settings → on right, click Edit Settings → select a personal pronouns from drop down list on left)
- O **Profile.** Fill in your canvas profile. ($Account \rightarrow Profile$ to edit your global Canvas profile).
- O **Notifications. Set Course Announcements** to 'Immediately'. (*Account* \rightarrow *Notifications* \rightarrow *find Announcements row* \rightarrow *click icon on right and change to immediately*)

Dashboard

- O **No action needed.** Once you're enrolled in my.Harvard AND the instructor has published the site, it will appear here automatically. (*Click once on a course card to enter the site.*)
- O **Full list of my enrolled courses** (Click *Courses* → *All Courses*) Note: If it says 'No' in far right published column, this means that the instructor has not yet published the site.

Optional Settings

- O **Calendar**. Some faculty may not choose to use this tool, so it is better to consult the instructor's syllabus instead. (*Import to office 365*, *google calendar*, or <u>apple calendar</u>)
- O **Record your Name Pronunciation** (Login to my.Harvard to record an audio of your name) If the Name Pronunciation tab is enabled by the instructor, you will find it on the left sidebar in a course.
