This resource guide will be a living document that we expect to evolve over time as we continue to deepen our knowledge of what is most important to our students with each incoming class. We also invite your suggestions and feedback as we continuously look to strengthen this resource.



NEIGHBORHOOD DESCRIPTIONS

Back Bay

Characterized by its old-fashioned brownstone houses, Parisian-style boulevards, tree-lined sidewalks, trendy shops, and tourist attractions, the Back Bay is a beautiful place to live. Back Bay features Copley Square, The Boston Common and Gardens, and the Charles River. Newbury Street is also located in the Back Bay, which boasts some of Boston's best shopping. Advantages of Back Bay include its proximity to BU's Medical Campus, offering many students the opportunity to either walk or bike to school. As with everything that is good, it has its drawbacks. Parking is very difficult, and the rent can tend to get a bit expensive. The area stretches from the heart of BU's Charles River campus to the Boston Gardens.

Beacon Hill

Located in the heart of Boston, Beacon Hill is home to Suffolk University, Massachusetts General Hospital, and a short walk from the Financial District and Government Center. The area features 19th and 20th century brownstones, cobblestone streets, old-fashioned narrow alleyways and occasional park-like areas with big trees. Because of its central location and Charles Street "T" stop on the Red Line, Beacon Hill also allows easy access to all of Boston's activities.

Consequently, this desirable, historic area is crowded, expensive, and the apartments are usually small. Due to narrow streets and overcrowding, parking is minimal.

Brookline Village

Brookline Village is one of the neighborhoods in Brookline that is within walking distance of the Longwood Medical Area, going south on Brookline Avenue. Here, too, you will find a wide range of ethnic and specialty restaurants. It is accessible by the subway. (Brookline Village stop on the D Green Line).

Coolidge Corner

One of the two neighborhoods in Brookline that are very close to the Longwood Medical Area, the other being Brookline Village. There is a wide range of ethnic and specialty restaurants here, and a variety of shops selling shoes, clothes, books and gifts. It is accessible by subway (Coolidge Corner train on the Green Line) and by bus (Route 66, 65 and 60).

Dorchester

As Boston's largest community, Dorchester remains very much a residential neighborhood. Due to its size, Dorchester has several smaller communities within it.

Rental prices in Dorchester are generally reasonable. Regal Victorians, triple-deckers, and waterfront spots in Savin Hill and Columbia Point offer an array of housing choices. Portions of Dorchester near the Harbor tend to be more expensive than their inland and more densely populated counterparts. Transportation along the Red Line is reliable and traveling time depends on the location and time of day, usually around 10-25 minutes. Some buses also pass by Boston Medical Center and Dudley Square Bus Station.

Fenway

The Fenway, perhaps best known as the home for the "boys of summer," is more than just a ballpark. It is actually a dense urban neighborhood with a considerable amount of green space (the "Fens").

Although the Fenway consists of a large number of college students, it

also contains a significant population of professionals, young and old. The famous, or infamous, Lansdowne Street, bordering the Mass Pike on the North and Fenway Park on he South, is home to many if Boston's most popular clubs and watering holes. If you travel the street, however, keep your eyes open for the occasional home run ball that clears the green monster.

Jamaica Plain

At the southern edge of Boston, there lies an inclusive and diverse location. A place where art and ideas are shared freely. It is a dynamic community with the luxury of a beautiful neighborhood. The hustle and bustle on Centre Street is balanced by the cool breeze off Jamaica pond and the enhancing greenery in the Arnold Arboretum.

Mission Hill

Once filled with farms and most of the breweries in Boston, Mission Hill today is an architectural landmark district with a combination of freestanding houses built by early wealthy landowners, blocks of traditional brick row houses, and many triple deckers. Many families and some students and staff from the nearby Longwood Medical Area come to Mission Hill for the affordable rents. A diverse community in proximity to downtown, Mission Hill offers its residents an excellent view of the neighborhood.

Roxbury

A drive through Roxbury is both a history lesson and a tour of a modern urban neighborhood. One of the oldest neighborhoods in Boston, Roxbury has long thrived on its proximity to downtown while retaining its

neighborhood qualities. Home to a great number of parks, schools and churches, a visitor can see Boston's history in the architecture and landmarks of the neighborhood. At the same time, Roxbury is a thriving community with a multitude of housing options and a variety of ethnic shops.

South End

Boston Medical Center is located in the South End, so the commute to school, in most cases, is a short walk or bike ride and very convenient. The area is undergoing a renovation and redevelopment, and some beautiful old homes from the past century are being restored, Victorian brick row houses.










Harvard Longwood Campus

DIRECTIONS BY CAR TO LONGWOOD MEDICAL AREA

From South of Boston

Take I-93 North to exit 26 (Cambridge / Storrow Drive). Keep left at the end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately 2.5 miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at the end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.

From West of Boston

Take I-90 East (Massachusetts Turnpike) to exit 18 (Cambridge / Allston). Bear tight after toll booth at end of exit ramp. Turn right after lights (before the bridge) onto Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive (about one mile) to Kenmore Square exit. Bear right at end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take the leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.

From North of Boston

Take I-93 South to exit 26 (Storrow Drive / North Station). Keep left at end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately 2.5 miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at the end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.

From Logan Airport

Take Rte, 1A South through Sumner Tunnel after leaving the airport. Watch for detour signs that periodically direct traffic north before allowing access to Rte, 1A south. After tunnel, turn right onto I-93 N. Follow I-93 N about 1/4 mile to exit 26 (Cambridge / Storrow Drive). Keep left at end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately 2.5 miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at the end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.



SUBWAY/TRAIN

The Green Line and Orange Line are the closest subway lines. The D (Riverside) and the E (Arborway) lines both have Longwood stops. For more information, please go to www.mbta.com. The closest Orange line stop is Ruggles (Northeastern), a 10 – 15 minute walk from the Longwood medical area. You can pay by Charlie Ticket or cash for single rides (\$2.75) or you can purchase a plastic CharlieCard and load a monthly T-pass on it. Using a CharlieCard the cost is \$2.25 a ride with free subway and bus transfers.

BUS

MBTA

Supplementing the rapid transit system are the MBTA buses. The buses provide cross-town service, run local routes in the city and suburbs, and connect the city with outlying areas. Bus fare for most routes is \$2.00 or \$1.70 with a CharlieCard (some of the longer routes and express routes cost more). Unlike transferring between connecting rapid transit lines, you must pay again when transferring from one bus to another or between rapid transit and buses. Get a T-Pass, either the Charlie Ticket which you can purchase at a T station or a CharlieCard which you can load with a monthly T-Pass and receive free bus transfers.
