

It was a big year for the Countway Community Garden, which is


finishing up its third year in operation. The garden, which is located next to Countway library (behind the bike cage), is run by a group of dedicated staff, student and faculty volunteers. This spring, compost was a big topic with the arrival of a new composter provided by EcoOpportunity and a donation of compost from City Soil.



plants grown this year included purple basil, ginger, peas, different types of mint and an assortment of bee-friendly wildflowers. The garden did make sure to keep volunteer favorites from past years including alpine strawberries, cherry tomatoes, oregano, lavender, chamomile, cucumbers and lemon verbena. The summer was not without its horticultural challenges with the fearless Longwood Medical Area squirrels munching on runner beans, carrots, kale and lettuce throughout the summer. Despite our furry neighbors helping themselves, the garden has enjoyed one of its most verdant and successful growing seasons to date. The garden volunteers celebrated the end of the Summer season in September with a Harvest Festival, which included a medicinal herb talk and a party in the garden with homemade baked goods, live music and tea made from dried herbs from the garden.
