#### Sebastian's (SPH)

- Compost disposable containers, including all cups, bowls, plates, coffee lids, utensils, napkins and straws
- Recycle soup lids

### Courtyard Café (HMS)

- Compost disposable containers, including all cups, bowls, plates
- Trash utensils

One more tip - ALL food waste is compostable.
