- Upload a jpg or pdf of your completed vaccination card to HUHS at mrecords@huhs.harvard.edu
- Request access to HSPH and/or 401 Park Drive/Landmark at hsph.me/accessandtesting
- When you come to HSPH campus Tap In your ID card at either the Kresge or FXB entrance. Enter Landmark as usual.
- If you need to test, pick up a test kit at one of the HSPH entrances. Follow the instructions and set up a Color account to track your testing. It is really easy to do, truly.
- Once you have activated your test kit and collected your sample, drop off your sample at either of the FXB or Kresge entrances or 3rd Floor at 401 Park Drive/Landmark.
