Cancer Epidemiology and Cancer Prevention Training Grant

The Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health's Department of Epidemiology is accepting pre-doctoral and post-doctoral fellows to train in Cancer Epidemiology.

Supported by the National Cancer Institute, this program's objective is to support pre- and post-doctoral fellows whose work is focused on cancer epidemiology and prevention; some of the studies are in diet, hormones, viruses & tumor biology, genetics, and physical activity & obesity.

Training Grant Details

Eligibility: Applicants must have U.S. Citizenship or admitted as a permanent resident at the time of appointment. Pre-doctoral candidates must have a baccalaureate degree & be enrolled in a doctoral program. Post-doctoral candidates must have a Ph.D. or M.D. or comparable doctoral degree from an accredited domestic or foreign institution.

Duration of Appointment: Typically 12 months but often renewed for an additional year and occasionally for two more years.

Application Materials: 2 letters of recommendation, statement of purpose/research interest, curriculum vitae/resume.

*for pre-doctoral applicants, the application for admissions will suffice, and no additional materials are needed.
