
Atypical Nevus Screening Questionnaire (ANQ)

On a recent HPFS questionnaire, you reported having an <u>atypical nevus (atypical/dysplastic mole)</u>. An atypical nevus/mole is a type of nevus/mole that looks different from a common nevus/mole and is often larger with borders that are not easy to see. Its color is usually uneven and can range from pink to dark brown. Parts of the nevus may be raised above the skin surface. An atypical nevus is NOT a melanoma or other skin cancer.
