I think having a strong team homework group will be very influential in how much you are able to learn throughout the semester. This was my most time-consuming class of the semester since team homework meetings took anywhere from 4-9 hours to complete for my team, but the professor is very clear that the only way you really understand modeling system dynamics is through time spent on collaborative practice. With that said, it was well worth the investment for me and was very helpful in learning practical ways to concretize complex systems (such as public health problems!) into meaningful insights for strategic management and policy decisions. This was especially true in the second half of the semester, where we walked through various common management scenarios. Assignments often demonstrated that typical management practices don't always lead to better outcomes. Learning how to take variables that are otherwise ambiguous and uncertain and operationalize them to see which of a system's feedback loops were most dominant in shaping outcomes is a really useful skill to employ in interdisciplinary issues.</p>	2
