## Cross-Registration Grade Policy

1. Cross-registration courses may be taken for Pass/Fail or Ordinal Grades, according to the course's listing in the my.harvard course catalog. Only the listed options will be available, excluding audit
2. MIT courses must be taken for an Ordinal Grade
3. Cross-registration courses may NEVER be taken for audit, even with the consent of the Instructor
4. Ordinal and Pass/Fail Grades are equivalent to HSPH grades and factor into a student's GPA and ordinal credit requirements accordingly
5. Harvard Business and Harvard Law each use unique ordinal grading systems. These grades do not convert into Harvard Chan School ordinal grades and therefore cannot be calculated into the GPA. However, they will count toward a student's Harvard Chan School ordinal credit requirements
6. Harvard Arts & Sciences, Harvard Medical and M.I.T. offer language courses, which students may enroll in, but which will not be posted to their Harvard Chan School transcript
