Curvita faculty data system coming in February

Curvita, a web-based system that will manage faculty career data and training grant information for all HSPH faculty, researchers, and post-docs, will launch in February, the Office of Research Strategy and Development announced. Curvita will automatically generate biosketches, CVs, activity reports and faculty websites, and NIH training grant tables.
