

## Harvard on the Move comes to Longwood



[Harvard on the Move](#), a University wellness initiative begun in Cambridge earlier this year, launched in the Longwood Medical area with a community walk on March 8 and has announced a weekly walk and run schedule.

The walks are normally around 2.5-3 miles in length and the runs include short (1-3 miles), medium (4-6 miles), and long (8-14 miles) routes. Meet on the pathway in the Harvard Medical School quad, near Longwood Avenue.

## HSPH awarded \$8 million from EPA for air pollution research
