Claims for reimbursement through your 2010 Medical/Dental Flexible Spending Account (FSA) and Dependent Care FSA must be submitted by Thursday, March 31. If you meet certain spending thresholds, you may also be eligible for the Copayment Reimbursement Plan. Deadline for claims submission for 2010 is also March 31.
