Evidence suggests that for the youngest children, prolonged or severe exposure to abuse, neglect and economic hardship - exacerbated by a dearth of stable, supportive relationships with adults -- can provoke a "toxic stress response" with lifelong health consequences. This *Forum* event will examine how health and education policies can be both harnessed and revamped to counteract early childhood adversity. It will include a discussion of a new policy statement, "Early Childhood Adversity, Toxic Stress, and the Role of the Pediatrician: Translating Developmental Science Into Lifelong Health," issued by the *American Academy of Pediatrics*.
