The U.S. Supreme Court Thursday upheld the constitutionality of the historic Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. Enacted in 2010, the law signaled significant health care reforms, but faced mounting criticism. This *Forum at HSPH* will explore the implications of the decision for Americans -- health care access, coverage, costs, and quality. Where do we go from here?
