Home stress, work stress linked with increased smoking



According to new HSPH research, there's a strong association between workfamily conflict and the likelihood of smoking. Workers who experienced stress at home from work and stress at work from personal issues were 3.1 times more likely to

smoke than those who didn't experience these two types of conflict, the researchers found. *Read more*
