Replacing juice with water, fruits, and vegetables in afterschool programs cuts calories



One in three U.S. children are overweight or obese, and growing evidence points to the empty calories they consume from sugary beverages as a substantial part of the problem. A new study by HSPH researchers finds

that efforts to serve children in afterschool programs plain water and replace juice with whole fruits and vegetables dropped the calories they were consuming in liquid form by nearly 70 per day. *Read more*
