
Making a difference while making a profit

HSPH researcher awarded \$5.6 million for role in new antibacterial resistance research effort

Scott Evans, senior research scientist in the Department of Biostatistics, has been awarded \$5.6 million for his role in the Antibacterial Resistance Leadership Group, a new clinical research network funded by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, part of the National Institutes of Health. Evans will direct the network's statistical and data management center, which is composed of a Statistical and Data Analysis Center located at HSPH and a Data Management and Informatics Center located at Duke University.

HarvardX's fall course lineup includes new HSPH offerings

Harvard is planning to offer a dozen new online courses in the 2013-14 school year through HarvardX—the University's branch of the online education platform edX— including new courses taught by HSPH faculty.

Recruitment to begin for new DrPH program
