Questions

- What are the changes we are trying to influence?
- What do we need to do to influence those changes?
- How will we know that we are making progress?

Answers

- Depends on context, our skills, skills of others
- Context changes

Possible Changes in Policy and Practice

- The right of women to respectful maternity care is embedded at all levels of the maternal health system
 - National, state/provincial, local
 - Policies, practices
- Women believe that they are entitled to Respectful Maternity Care


Possible Actions*

- Private meetings with policymakers
- Meetings with health officials
- Participation on working groups or advisory committees
- Work with supportive health workers to influence others
- Engagement of high-profile people
 - To raise public awareness
 - To talk with policymakers
- Media
- Community mobilization
- Awareness raising with women
- Production and dissemination of research
- Collection and dissemination of women's stories
- Monitoring and reporting of abuse and neglect in the health system
