Villagers Stone Workers Tracking Ebola in Sierra Leone

Sierra Leone's Minister of Health and Sanitation said on May 30 that two people died of Ebola and seven cases of the virus have been confirmed as villagers in a village in Kailahun District threatened medical staff trying to control the spread of the disease. Two patients died in that District, Anansa, Jamba, director of disease prevention and control at the ministry of health, said in an interview. Villagers threw stones at medical staff who were trying to inspect one of the bodies on that day. There is denial among the people about the Ebola virus, Jamba said. Members of parliament from both Kenema and Kailahun together with the ministry of health officials have left Freetown to engage the communities and

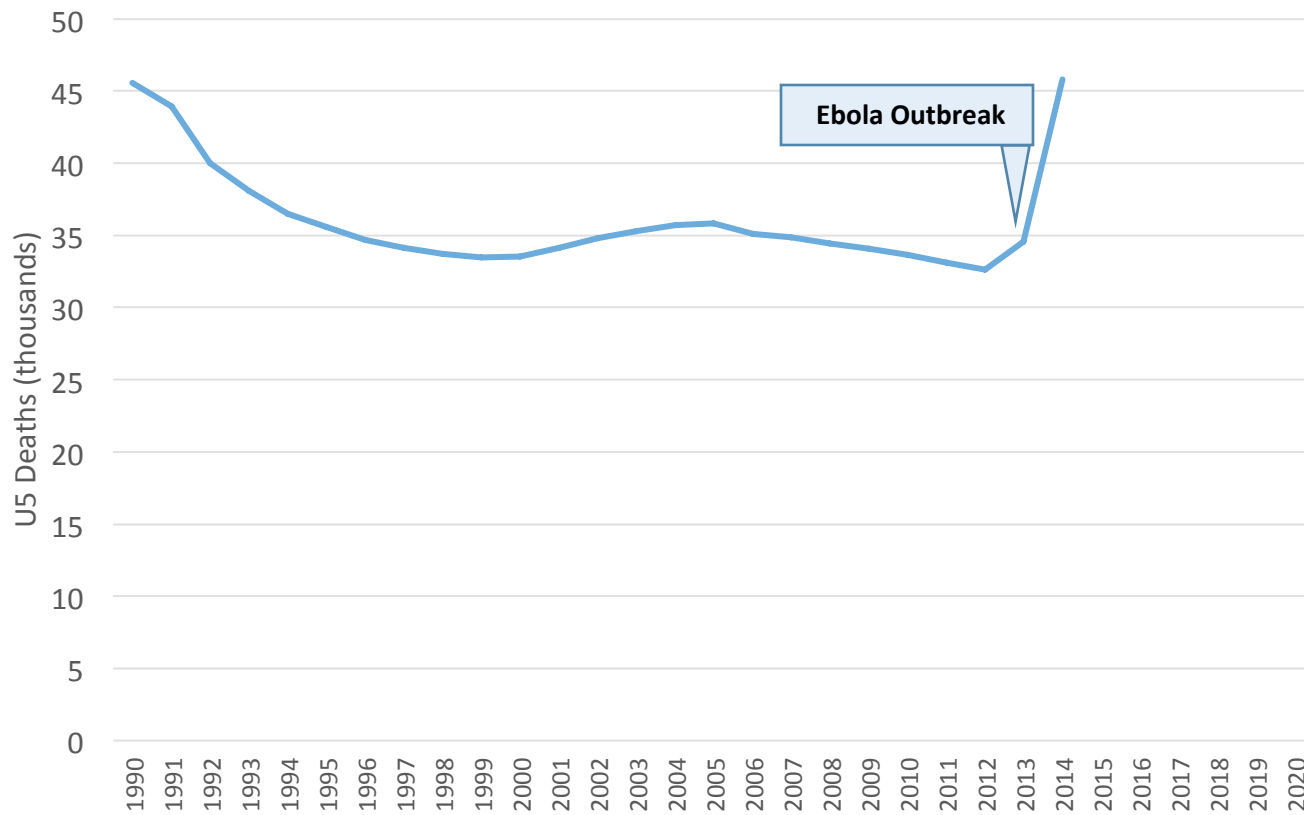
