## NCMS Insurance Benefit Package (detail)

In 2010, a health insurance intervention was introduced in two counties in Ningxia (Haiyuan and Yanchi) which used a single risk pool to fund both inpatient and outpatient services, increased reimbursement rates for outpatient services, including drugs purchased at health facilities, and set reimbursement rates higher at lower level facilities (i.e. primary care providers) than at county hospitals. The changes aim to increase coverage for primary and preventive care, encourage utilization of lower level primary health care facilities, and provide greater financial risk protection. Over time, the provincial NCMS department adopted our interventions. Therefore, the benefit package in comparison counties Tongxin, Pengyang, and Xiji became very similar to ours in later years. Tables 1 and 2 provide more detail on the benefit package design.
