



The Harvey V. Fineberg Fellowship in Cancer Prevention 2016-2017

The Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health's Department of Epidemiology invites applications for the Harvey Fineberg Fellowship in Cancer Prevention (2016-2017).

The program's objective is to support students whose work is focused on cancer prevention. This may vary from etiologic studies to behavior or health services types of approaches to cancer prevention. Fellows will typically engage in a core set of courses that focus on cancer prevention and may also join in activities of working groups that address issues of interest to the trainees. They will have the opportunity to serve as educators and leaders through open seminars, attend lunches with fellow recipients and departments, and most importantly be a part of the Fineberg community.

Fellowship details

Eligibility: The Award is given to one individual studying cancer prevention per academic year. The Fellowship is not restricted to U.S. citizens, and some preference may be given to international students (non-citizen/resident), as they are not eligible for training grants. (*See application document*)

Award Amount: The Fellowship Award ranges from \$12,000 - \$16,000 per year. This can be used to cover tuition and fees or received as a stipend

Application Deadline: February 1, 2016

Application Timeline: All materials must be received on or before February 1, 2016. The directors will review the applications and notify the recipient before March 1, 2016. The Fellowship lasts for one academic year with a start date between June 1, 2016 and September 1, 2016. Recipients are eligible to receive the Fellowship more than once, but must reapply for each year.
