<sup>6</sup>Housing: This expense is an AVERAGE cost, and \$1,786/month generally means sharing an apartment with a roommate. Monthly rates for Harvard student apartment buildings vary; for Shattuck House, ranges are \$1,800-\$2,350 for a 1-bedroom, \$2,800-\$3,000 for a 2-bedroom, and \$1,400-\$1,500 for a shared 2-bedroom. Off-campus housing rates vary greatly depending on but not limited to location, number of roommates, and size. Boston is considered one of the most expensive cities to live in in the US. Housing cost for students living on-campus may vary.

**International students: Harvard** Chan VISA certification requires international students to demonstrate specific levels of support prior to the issuance of an I-20 or DS-2019 — please note that the levels required for visa certification may be higher than COA.
