INFLUENZA A(H1N1)/ SWINE FLU SURVEY III

The study was conducted for the Harvard School of Public Health via telephone by SSRS/ICR, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from June 22 to June 28, 2009 among a nationally representative sample of 1823 respondents 18 years of age or older. Of those a total of 260 respondents were Hispanic and a total of 315 respondents were Non-Hispanic African Americans. A total of 305 interviews were conducted with respondents on cell phones. The margin of error for total respondents is +/-2.82% at the 95% confidence level.
